GOAL SUMMARY

- 7. How can we more earnestly grow in the presence of the Holy Spirit this week?

In Baptism we are given the Theological Virtues of Faith, Hope, and Charity. These virtues guide us in living a life of holiness. The Gifts of the Holy Spirit, which are bestowed upon us at Confirmation, strengthen and enable us to boldly live out our Baptismal call. By invoking the aid of the Holy Spirit, we invite God into our lives to build us up and support us in living a Christian life.

At the end of the video, Buchi invites us to pray for LIGHT from the Holy Spirit so we can see which cardinal virtues and Gifts of the Holy Spirit we need to grow in to be more Christ-like. Let us pray for this grace and so be attentive to the ways in which God invites us to grow in virtue. Pray together this prayer for holiness:

Breathe in me, O Holy Spirit, that my thoughts may all be holy. Act in me, O Holy Spirit, that my work, too, may be holy. Draw my heart, O Holy Spirit, that I love only what is holy.
